Chairman William Hepler called the meeting to order and opened with the "**Pledge of Allegiance**" and a "**Moment of Silence**".

Motion was made by Weingartner to **Approve the July, 2018 Minutes.** 2nd by Hepler. All in favor.

PUBLIC INPUT:

Tootie Welsh – Wanting on the record, Welsh said the Wayne Twp. Fire Dept. said the Township has "**electric brakes on their fire trucks**". Welsh explained a township situation that occurred on July 15, 2017, where Supervisor, Chuck Hutchison, said the Chewton fire truck tanker, driven by Tony Biega, was driven up to Hutchison's house **to obtain brake fluid** for the fire truck as the township was out of fluid, and they needed the fluid right now.

- ...Welsh asked if the Wayne Township Building be used for elections should the Chewton Firehall not be available.
- ...Asked if the township follows the International Maintenance Code. Atty. Long replied, "yes".
- ...Welsh brought up about the hydrant check in January

Ron Aiken – wanted to thank the person responsible for the tar & chip paving done from Chewton- Wurtemberg Road & on up. Aiken said it was a "great job". Roger Stramba spoke up and said, "I did another road too".

Rodger Leddon - resident from Old Pittsburg Road, was having drainage problems in-front of his house. He said he spoke to PennDot to see what they could do to slow the water down. Water was coming down from Friday Hill Road and he asked the township if we could help.

Wes Cunningham – said a new group of people are going to take over the Chewton Vol. Fire Dept. He suggested they may need supervised.

Dorothy Pogozelec – felt the township did a disservice to her son, Ed Pogozelec. She said her son even plowed snow in the wintertime, etc. Hepler told her he was a great employee and did a good job for the township. Hepler explained the insurance company caught up with the township and said Mr. Pogozelec was not insurable. The Insurance company would not insure him.

NEW BUSINESS:

Ratify any & all bills since January 1, 2018. Czerpak asked what bill was being ratified? Supervisors said it was the \$250.00 ins. ded.. Motion by Weingartner; 2nd by Hepler. Motion carried. Czerpak questioned if there were any new policies in place.
