REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING
February 2, 2023

The regular monthly meeting of the Wayne Township Board of Supervisors was held on Thursday, February 2, 2023, at 6:00 P.M. at the Wayne Township Building, 1418 Wampum Road, Ellwood City, PA.
